

Just a reminder to keep up the reading and return your forms and sponsor money to school by Friday 21st January ©




ATTENDANCE MATTERS

HEAD LICE

We have had a number of cases of head lice reported throughout school. Can I please urge you all to check your children's hair tonight and treat if necessary.

If your child has long hair, please send them to school with it tied up.

This is some information from the NHS Website for treating head lice:

Wet combing - Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this method first.

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

- wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)
- comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends

It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.

Medicated lotions and sprays

Ask a pharmacist for advice if you have tried wet combing for 17 days, but your child still has live head lice.

They may recommend using medicated lotions and sprays. These kill head lice in all types of hair, and you can buy them from pharmacies, supermarkets or online.
