






AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH

UNIFORM

We feel that school uniform is very desirable for a number of reasons and it is our expectation that all children will wear it.

The uniform consists of:

- Deep royal blue jumper/cardigan or school sweatshirt
- Light blue polo shirt
- Black skirt/pinafore/trousers/shorts or official tartan kilt/pinafore. Blue gingham dress (Summer)
- Black school shoes- no trainers, pumps or heels
- Black/white socks or Black tights

Jewellery

Jewellery (apart from one pair of small stud earrings) should not be worn in school because of the risk of injury, particularly during P.E.

No body piercing is allowed and earrings are not allowed to be worn by children who are going swimming with school.

Nail polish and false nails are not allowed either.

Hair

Hair should be neat and tidy and pupils with long hair should have it tied back off the face. Hair styles should at all times be appropriate for school. Extreme hairstyles are not permitted.

We have a large amount of jumpers, PE hoodies and fleeces that have been left lying around school with no names in. If you are missing any, please call into the school office. Could we remind you that all clothing should be labelled with your child's name. Thank you.




